Read the following passage and try to identify and highlight 14 uses of adverbials:


In the tropical rainforest, the climate is warm and wet. In contrast, the desert is usually hot and dry.

Near the Earth's equator where tropical rainforest ecosystems are found, high temperatures cause water to evaporate quickly and, consequently, there is frequent rainfall in forested areas. Subsequently, the rainforest ecosystem is very humid.

On the other hand, deserts occur in a variety of locations. They are usually at low latitudes but at higher latitudes there are cold deserts.

Most rainforests have very high levels of rain, at least 2000mm per year. In comparison, desert precipitation levels are less than 300mm per year. Despite this, some plants do grow in the desert and are specially adapted to very dry conditions.
