Science Week



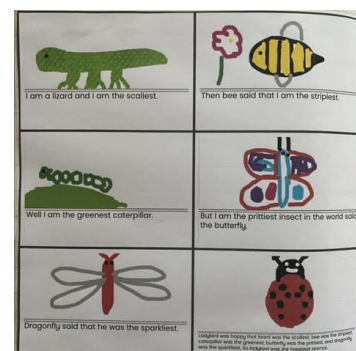
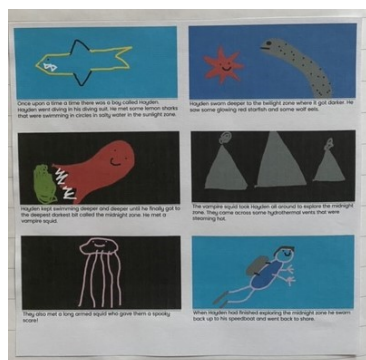
