- 6a. Various answers, for example: Our parents have known about the window that you broke in the garage for a while now.

Greater Depth

- 7a. Liam is incorrect as he needs to use the past participles of teaching and grasp, which is taught and grasped.
- 8a. Various answers, for example: With your charming personality and wit, I would have thought that you would have made friends really quickly.
- 9a. Various answers, for example: The dog has hidden under the blanket because there have been fireworks going off tonight.

Greater Depth

- 7b. Natalie is incorrect as she needs to use the past participles of buying and seek, which is bought and sought.
- 8b. Various answers, for example: I have spoken your teacher and we both agree that you have achieved all of your targets.
- 9b. Various answers, for example: The birds have heard a terrifying noise, so they have flown out of the tree in fright.
