Can We Always Trust the Internet?

Sometimes, strangers are trying to trick you but it is hard to tell who to trust.

Sometimes, strangers may pretend to be children so that they can talk to you.



How Can We Stay Safe Online?

- Use websites that are for children.
- Never tell anyone your name, address or passwords.
- Never meet an online friend without telling an adult.
- Ask an adult before clicking on a file someone sends you.
- If you feel uncomfortable or unsure about anything online, tell an adult.



Did You Know...?

- Anyone can use the Internet to post pictures, videos or comments. Sadly, some people may lie about who they are or what has happened.
- Some websites have viruses that can stop our devices from working properly. Think before you click!
