Free School Meals

The way in which schools are funded has changed and it is therefore important for the school to record children who are eligible for free school meals accurately. If you receive one of the following benefits you may qualify for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Child Tax credit (not including Working Tax Credit) if the household income is below £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance.

This week in class:

Acorn

This week we have been learning the 'o' and 'l' phonemes. We have been busy writing lots of words and making octopus crafts! In Maths, we have been learning to talk about and compare the length of objects. We have also been working on our counting skills and trying to count backwards from 20. We have started gymnastic lessons in PE and the children were very excited to try out the equipment for the first time. This week, we were learning how to use the equipment safely and how to land safely when jumping off the apparatus. The children have also enjoyed playing in our Post Office role play area; they have been writing lots of cards and letters to each other!

Willow

It has been lovely to see the children back at school this week and they have enjoyed sharing their news about the holidays. Our Maths topic for the next couple of weeks is time and the children have already been finding o'clock and half past times on clocks. We have looked at analogue clocks this week and matching clocks to written times. The children have also been practising their counting skills. In English we have been looking at sentence structure and thinking about when to use different punctuation to end a sentence. The children have started exploring good places to use exclamation marks in their sentences. In RE we have talked about the Bible and will be learning about some Old Testament stories over the next couple of weeks. In our topic work we have been thinking about what qualities a hero needs and have started preparing the cover for our new topic books.

Beech

Happy New Year! Beech Class are entering the exciting topic of 'Time Detectives'! We wrote about our Christmas holidays using time vocabulary and set our writing in the past tense. In Maths we reminded ourselves of lots of time facts and practiced telling the time in 5 minute blocks. RE led us to look at Jesus' character, discuss who he is and what Christians believe is special about him. We read and acted out the story of Jesus and the storm. Beech created a very loud whirling and crashing storm, thank goodness we had Jesus to tell them all to "hush"!

Maple

The children have made a great start to their learning in 2017! We have worked on writing recounts of the holidays. We began by talking and sharing our news. Next we looked at the key features of a recount and worked on writing past tense verbs. We planned our writing by organising information into paragraphs, before writing the recounts. One of our targets this year is to edit and improve our writing, so we finished off the week by working on these skills.

Keep up the good work with learning times tables. This year we are working on the 3, 4 and 8 times tables, to add to 2, 5 and 10.

You will be receiving an information sheet on handy tips for learning spellings at home, and also a letter informing you of the topics we will be covering this term. They will be in homework books next week.

Chestnut

The class discussed the idea of 'New Year's Resolutions' and thought of their own, personal resolution for the year. In English the children looked at how dictionaries can help to support their written work and enable them to be more independent. In Maths the class reviewed their knowledge of 'time' and started to solve time problems.

Lilac

Welcome back to Lilac Class and a very Happy New Year! It is so lovely to be back and the children are really looking after me! They are certainly refreshed and ready to learn. We have started our Science Topic about Earth and Space and I am so impressed with the knowledge they already have and their enthusiasm for the subject. We have also started to learn our space songs for the Tunbridge Wells Singing Festival in March. Our individual item will be 'I Can See Clearly Now' and so many of the children know this song already and can sing it beautifully. In RE this week we have been thinking about true and false facts related to the Bible and have been thinking about what the Bible means to us, as individuals. Our main topic this term will be about the Ancient Mayans and we will start this next week.

Oak

This week we have started our new topic 'Into the Death Zone' by locating on a map the main mountain ranges of the world. Linked to this, in our English work, we have been researching the seven highest summits and beginning to plan a report.

We have been drawing nets of 3-D shapes in our Maths work and we have also been revisiting decimals.

Water at School
