This week in class:

Acorn

This week we have been learning the f and v phonemes. We have been working on reading and writing words with more confidence and the children really enjoyed visiting the library this week, the staff in the library commented on how well behaved we all were. In Maths, we have been learning about the 'teen' numbers; we have been learning about how these numbers are made up (e.g. 10+2=12). In RE we have been learning about the stories Jesus would have been told when he was a boy. We saw some very funny pictures of Mrs Johnson when she was a little girl and we talked about the fact that she liked to do the same things that we like doing; playing with toys, games with our friends and listening to stories. We then heard the story of baby Moses in the bulrushes and talked about the fact that Jesus would have been told this story too when he was a little boy.

In their play, the children have been exploring the frost and ice and looking at all the lovely patterns that the frost makes. We have also been listening to story CDs, doing lots of colouring, playing on the bikes and scooters and, following on from our PE sessions, doing lots of yoga and dance.

We are hoping to all be feeling a bit healthier next week and that Miss Williams will be back with us after a bad case of the lurgies.

Willow

This week Willow Class have been learning about rhyming words, writing in the past tense and been retelling the story of 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson. We have also been re-reading the story of 'Supertato Veggies Assemble' by Sue Hendra. In Science the children have been helping Supertato find a good material for a crash mat for Tommy Tomato who keeps falling off of the conveyor belt in the supermarket. In RE the children have been learning about the story of Moses and the Ten Commandments. They have also been thinking about rules that they have to follow. In Maths the children have been sequencing events in a day, answering word questions about time and completed a Maths quiz about measuring things in a zoo. It has been a busy week!

Beech

We have been extremely busy in Beech Class this week. In Literacy, we used our imagination to visualise and explore the inside of the Great Hall of a medieval castle. We then used prepositional phrases and adjectives to create some fantastic descriptive sentences. We were also very careful to use capital letters, commas and full stops to punctuate our work accurately. In Numeracy, we expanded our understanding of place value and used this to help add 2 digit numbers. First, we explored how 2 digit numbers could be partitioned in a variety of ways. Then, we utilised our partition skills to add tens and ones separately. In Science, we deepened our understanding of the parts of a plant. First, we learned a range of scientific vocabulary. Then, we used these words to help explain the jobs of each part of the plant. In PE, we developed a range of different balances before using them to create gymnastic routines.

Beech Class excelled themselves on Thursday, using awesome adjectives to describe objects you might find in a castle. They also included the use of commas, prepositional phrases and pronoun verbs. In Maths, they have continued to add 2 digit numbers together, looking at the tens and ones, in the vertical partition method and using a number line. In Art this week we are looking at 'Scraffito', which involves a layer of light colour, a layer of darker colour over the top and then scratching your picture through. If you have time try some at the weekend!

Maple

We have been inspired by the book 'The Ink Garden of Brother Theophane' to produce our own natural dyes. In small groups we cut and prepared ingredients, before boiling them to extract the colour. We have a range of dyes made from red cabbage, turmeric, carrots and teal We will be using the experience to write an explanation, and have already been looking at the features of these kinds of texts. We have also been getting to grips with using apostrophes to show plural possession.

We brushed up on our History and Geography skills when we investigated the growth and eventual decline of the Roman Empire. The children were fantastic at spotting changes over time and raised some really interesting questions about the invasion of Britain. In RE we read the story of Moses and the Burning Bush and discussed our own feelings of awe and wonder. We looked at pictures of

some spectacular natural sights and lots of us had our breath taken away!

It is wonderful having everyone in class joining in with PE. We are so lucky to have experts come in to help us with ball skills and gymnastics. Both sessions are thoroughly enjoyed by the children.

Chestnut

This week Chestnut Class have been exploring proclamations some more. We have created our own from the Gods to create a display in our classroom. In Maths we have been looking at multiplying by 0,1 and dividing by 1. Moving on to multiplying 3 numbers together and using these skills to solve problems. On Wednesday afternoon we were lucky enough to visit the church for our own Class Mass. The class have been planning and writing explanations, using examples to support their writing. They have focussed on editing and improving the different paragraphs. In Maths the class identified which multiplication table they needed to focus on and used different strategies to help them remember the facts. They continued to focus on time conversion problems, making sure they remembered important time facts. In Science the children looked at the history of electricity (very interesting!). They then created electrical circuits and tested different materials to see if they were conductors or insulators. In RE the class read the 'Parable of the Unmerciful Servant'.

Lilac

In Maths this week, we have been continuing our work about fractions. We have been converting mixed numbers into improper fractions and improper fractions into mixed numbers. We have also been focusing on mathematical reasoning and explaining why various statements are true or false and whether we agree with them or not. In English, we have linked our topic work with the Ancient Mayans and are working on a diary account of a Spanish Conquistador. We are working on describing setting by thinking about how we felt, what we saw, smelt and heard as we travelled through the tropical rainforests of Mesoamerica and then discovered the ancient ruins of the Mayans. In Science, Lilac Class have been studying the Moon and why it changes shape. We have also been learning about the movement of the Sun, Moon and the Earth. In Music, we have been listening to The Planets Suite composed by Holst. We designed posters about what the pieces entitled Venus and Mars made us feel and the dynamics and instruments we heard. In RE, Lilac Class have continued our work about the books in the Bible and we have discussed how reading them helps us live our lives. Fr John followed up the Year 5 Mass, that was held on Monday afternoon, by coming into our class and answering further questions about the parish of St Barnabas' and St Barnabas' Church.

Oak

During our English work this week, we have been editing, improving and re-writing our mountain reports. The children are now in the process of using Publisher and Word to transform their written reports into a leaflet. In Maths, we have been improving our division skills, symmetry and accurately reflecting shapes.

They then reflected on acts of kindness and what it means to be forgiven.

We have been learning how to spell words ending in 'cial' and 'tial' in our spelling work while in Science we have been finding out about how species adapt to suit their environments,
