

Story Starter Ideas

Consider the following questions before starting. Re-telling the whole story may require screen shots to support children.

- What country or area of the world could this be set or is it a fictional place?
- Why was the girl wearing antlers in the first place?
- What were the huge animals? What do they eat? Do they have any predators? Do they have a purpose or any magical qualities?
- Could this be told in the style of a diary with her getting older throughout the story? How do her feelings change throughout?
- What metaphors or analogies can be made about the story? Is it about growing up, loss, losing touch with nature, altruism?

Quick Teaching Idea - Teach an Idiom

Origins - "The Law of the Jungle" was a poem by R. Kipling (1894) where he lists the laws followed by the Wolf Pack Council., which include obedience, killing and loyalty. 'The Jungle Book' also mentions the laws of the woods and water.

<u>Modern Meaning</u> - We now use the phrase in a reduced sense when we mean kill or be killed, dog eat dog or a situation where self-interest is the only important thing.

Children create their own sentences using the idiom.
