Class News

Acorn Class News:

This week we have been learning to read and write complex words with the ee, oo, oi and or digraphs in Phonics. We have been continuing to write our ladybird information books in English. In Maths, we have been learning to solve problems by using clues to guess the number or shape that someone is thinking of. We have been on lots of bug hunts this week and the children have been fascinated by all of the insects they have found. They really enjoyed our Bedtime Stories afternoon yesterday, and the children spent the afternoon reading books with their friends and teddies before watching The Gruffalo (one of our favourite class stories!)

Willow Class News:

This week the children in Willow Class have been busy writing a range of poems and a story linked to our topic of toys. They have been using rhyming words, adjectives and similes to make their writing more interesting. In Phonics, the children have been practising the u-e split digraph and been reading real and nonsense words using the letters sounds to practise for Phonics Screening in June. In Maths, the children have been learning about money. They have been learning to recognise coins, make different totals and have been finding the difference between two amounts. In Art and DT this week, Willow Class have doing still life drawing of toys and started to paint their clay animals.

Beech Class News:

Our last day of tennis involved practicing all the skills we have learnt. Fabulous serves, volleys and rallies! In R.E. we looked at the 1 Corinthians ch 13 v 4-7 passage which talks about love being patient, kind, generous, forgiving, just and honest. Then in small groups we acted out a scenario to show these values. At the end of a very hot and busy day they all worked brilliantly as a team. Fantastic learning this term Beech Class, we are very proud of you all.

Maple Class News:

This week we have worked on a variety of skills in our English lessons. The children have used dictionary and thesaurus skills to edit the persuasive letters they wrote last week. They have also amended punctuation to shorten over-long sentences and added conjunctions to extend others. We have also used artwork by Georges Seurat and Jaques Louis David as inspiration for writing pieces featuring prepositions, noun phrases and direct speech. I have been very impressed with the quality of their writing.

As part of our learning in Maths, we have been identifying right angles, acute angles and obtuse angles. We are constantly working on our times tables, so please keep on learning x3, x4 and x8 over the holidays. We use that knowledge in many areas of Maths.

In Science, we have looked at food groups and the foods that fall into the categories of carbohydrates, proteins, fats and sugars. We have created illustrations of balanced meals using examples from those food groups. We have also begun studying skeletons, learning why we have them, and labelling diagrams using our own model.

Chestnut Class News:

This week in Chestnut Class we have been looking at decimals and their equivalent fractions, learning how to round decimals up to the nearest number and using these skills to solve problems. In English we thought about someone famous that we really admire and wrote a dialogue as if we were being interviewed by them, we then used this to write an autobiography. We have also looked at extending noun phrases to add interest to our writing. As part of our topic the children have worked very hard over the last couple of weeks by designing, making and decorating their own Egyptian pots.

The class have been writing the final draft of their story about a 'Mysterious Parcel'. The children have used a wide range of techniques, to keep the audience interested. In Maths the children used their skills to plot coordinates in the second quadrant. In Science the class researched creatures living in our immediate environment and took part in a survey on our school grounds. In RE the class learnt about a Jewish wedding ceremony.

Lilac Class News:

In Maths this week, Lilac Class have been converting different units of metric measurement; we have also focused on the relationship between imperial and metric units of measurement. In English, we have been looking at prefixes that have meaning, for example, auto, bi, anti and super. We have developed our dictionary skills by looking up words that begin with these prefixes. We have also been revisiting parenthesis, using commas, dashes and brackets in our sentences. In Science, we have been learning about the different parts of a flower and wind and insect pollination. In Geography, we moved on from rivers to the sea this week. We looked at sea erosion and how caves, arches and stacks are formed and compared cliffs and coastlines from two different areas of Britain. In RE, we are coming to the end of our work about Atonement and Salvation and thought about why sacrifice is a gift. We looked at the story of Abraham and Isaac to illustrate this idea. In PE, we have been practising our javelin skills, thinking about technique and precision. In Art, we started our big sea frieze of the Titanic, using a range of different materials.

Oak Class News:

This week in our English work, the children have been writing a newspaper report about the outbreak of the Second World War. We listened to Neville Chamberlain's broadcast and looked at examples of newspaper headlines from the days after the announcement.

In Maths, the children have continued to work on their group projects. This week they have been concentrating on creating an information leaflet and working out the running costs of their theme park.

In our topic work, we have been finding out about rationing and the 'Dig for Victory' campaign. The children then designed their own World War Two garden.
