Class News

Acorn Class News:

This week we have been reading and writing words containing the oa and ai digraphs and the igh trigraph in Phonics. In English, we have begun our topic of Fairytales by reading The Three Little Pigs and writing story maps to show the main events in this story. In Maths, we have been learning to add two numbers by counting along a number line. Due to the windy weather, the children have been exploring how the wind can move fabric and some have even made kites at the creative table before testing them outside. We enjoyed playing parachute games in PE yesterday and we also had a very interesting discussion about the General Election in our circle time!

Willow Class News:

This week Willow class have been busy practising reading real and 'alien' words ready for the Phonics screening next week. It has been lovely to see how the children's knowledge and confidence has grown. In English, we have been learning about where to use capital letters and what a proper noun is. In Maths, the children have learning about arrays and recording number sentences to represent them. They have also been practising their number bonds (adding and subtracting) for 10 and 20. In RE we have been learning about the story of The Good Samaritan and thinking about how to be a good friend.

Beech Class News:

In English, we have been focusing on instruction writing. We started by using our understanding of imperative verbs to create individual command sentences. We then worked in pairs to select 6 of our favourite command sentences and use them as the basis for a piece of instructional writing. We used question sentences to create a short introduction and then a range of different writing techniques to add detail to the commands. We used adjectives and adverbs to add more precision and then explored how connectives could be used to add additional clauses to each command. In Maths, we focused on giving and receiving sets of directions. We used the skills we had gained earlier in the year during ICT lessons to create sets of directional instructions for our partners to follow. In ICT, we continued to use the animation skills we have been developing to create an animated bug-box. First, we designed a bug-box background. Next, we used our knowledge of the bugs in our local habitat to create a set of characters which we then animated. Finally, we created a title page which introduced our animation and gave instructions for people wishing to access it.

This term we are starting kwik cricket skills. Yesterday Beech Class became world class underarm bowlers for the afternoon. We are looking forward to progressing into batting and fielding. In R.E. we talked about who St Barnabas was and the power of his name, then the meaning of our names and making emblems to represent them. In English we learnt some mini beast poetry, then wrote our own poems. In Maths we solved 2D and 3D pattern problems. A very busy first week back.

Maple Class News:

In Maths this week we have been brushing up on our column addition skills. We have moved from adding 2 digit numbers with no carrying, to 3 digits with carrying. Great progress. We have also continued learning about shapes, with a focus on lines. All the children can identify horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines.

We have been learning about how to use the possessive apostrophe with plurals in English. Using a painting by LS Lowry we have challenged ourselves to remember the rules and write statements about the characters and buildings we have looked at.

We completed our Science work on humans and animals by looking at the function of skeletons, including exoskeletons. We had fun trying to identify which animals particular skeletons belonged to. We have now moved onto our next Science topic, which is plants. The children learned to name and label the different parts of a plant and will be learning about pollination and seed dispersal over the next few weeks.

We are currently organising a trip to the Sea Life Centre in Hastings, which will take place later in the term. Details will follow as soon as we have confirmation of the date.

Chestnut Class News:

In English the class planned and drafted an adventure story about going through a magical door. The children have really developed their story-writing skills and their ideas are very appealing! In Maths the children worked on how to find the area of a rectangle and other straight-sided shapes. In Science the class were given different habitats and they had to design a creature that would successfully adapt to that particular environment. We had some great ideas! This week Chestnut Class have been using different resources to research and make notes on Jean-Francois Champollin. The children then used their notes to create a fact file. In Maths we have been looking at different ways to represent information in the form of graphs and charts and how to interpret these.

Lilac Class News:

In Maths this week, Lilac Class have still been thinking about conversion, but this time we have looked at converting units of time and the relationship between analogue and digital time. In English, we have started to draft a report about marine pollution using persuasive writing. We took notes from a CBBC Newsround report as a basis for our writing. In RE, we finished our work about Atonement and Salvation by looking at the Jewish Festival of Yom Kippur and thinking about mistakes we have made in our own lives, and how we can make things right with the people around us. In Science this week, we have been learning about the differences between wind and insect pollinated plants. Our topic work this week has involved designing posters to promote recycling and how we can prevent marine pollution. In Art, we have continued with our Titanic frieze and in Music we have started to learn our songs for our school production 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'.

Oak Class News:

We have continued our topic work this week by looking at the life of Anne Frank. The children have carried out research and are in the process of writing her biography.

We have also started to prepare for our end of year production of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. On Wednesday, we held auditions for each part and then, Ms Mercer and I had some very tricky decisions to make!

In Maths, the children have continued to work on their Theme Park projects.
