

Kent Test registration for Year 5

We have sent out an email to the year 5 parents this week to remind them that the Kent Test for entry 2024 registration is currently open. Please see more information below:

"Registration for the Kent Test for children due to **start secondary school in September 2024** opened on Thursday 1 June 2023 and will close at midnight on Monday 3 July 2023. We cannot accept late registrations.

Assessment is normally done through testing during the autumn term. This year, the tests are due to take place on **Thursday 7 September 2023** for pupils in Kent primary schools, and on the weekend of **Saturday 9 September 2023** for other pupils. Any reference to 'Kent Test' or 'registration' does not guarantee when or if testing will take place.

The assessment results will be sent on Wednesday 18 October 2023 after 4pm."
