### What is important to Sikh people?

<b>Sikhism</b>	Name of the Sikh religion
<b>Sikh</b>	disciple or learner
<b>Waheguru</b>	Wonderful Lord Sikh name for God.
<b>Guru</b>	Sikh name for teacher
<b>Guru Nanak</b>	The first Sikh Guru, who began to speak the message of God's oneness and universal love.
<b>Khalsa</b>	Special group of Sikhs, who have taken part in the Amrit ceremony.
<b>5 K's</b>	Khalsa Sikhs wear 5 symbols, which represent different elements of their faith.

Sikhs believe there were ten human gurus. They all had the same role to share the light of God.


