

Washing a Woolly Mammoth

Warning

Washing a mammoth is some times harder
than you think!



Instruction List For Washing a Woolly Mammoth

You will need....

Your cleaning kit which should include, Antibacterial Hoof Wash, Mammoth Body Broom, Woolly Ear Wax Remover, and Mammoth Smell Extinguisher.

Liquid soap

Cake for tempting

A Towel



1. Turn on the taps and adjust the temperature, be careful not to make it too hot!



2. Encourage your wooly mammoth in to the bath tempting them with the cake if needed.



3. Lather the liquid soap all over its fur. Make sure to rub in between his ears.



4. Next, cover hoofs with the Antibacterial Hoof Wash to stop infection.



5. After your mammoth has had a good soak you must rinse off any bubbles by carefully pouring clean water over him. Try not to get any bubbles in his eyes!



6. Once you are really sure that your mammoth is completely clean, get him out of the bath tub.



7. Warning! this is the really messy part. Quickly wrap the towel around your mammoth before he starts to spray everywhere.



8. Now you can start brushing your mammoth's fur with the body broom. The Extendable Mammoth Body Broom will help you reach all the parts you can't reach easily.
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9. Congratulations you are nearly finished. Place ear wax nozzle inside the ear hole and suck out any loose wax. Be careful not to push it in too far as this will hurt.



10. Finally, roll on smell extinguisher under your mammoth's arms and legs to prevent them from smelling bad!
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11. If you have more than one mammoth this list of instructions will be useless and you may need lots of help.
