Science and Computing	Create a poster (or even a model) to show the structure of the human inner ear and how it works. Do some research to consider the following: <i>Why should we remember Boudicca? Was she a hero or a villain? Have a look at some of the images of her, including the statue in Westminster. What does she look like? How is she shown? How do we know what she looked like? Why do you think she is shown the way she is? Why do you think Boudicca rebelled against the Romans?</i> You could produce a poster to reflect whether you think she was a hero or a villain!	Explain the myth of Romulus and Remus and the foundation of Rome. You can do this in writing or in a comic book style. You can find various retellings of it on YouTube if you want to refresh your memory.	Challenge yourself to see how many European countries and their capitals you can name. Get someone to time you and then challenge them to beat your score!
Design and the Arts	From your work on investigation, have a go at creating your own catapult based on a Roman design.	Find out about Roman catapults and plan how you can make your own. You can then test it to see how far your missile travels.	Explain your choice of materials and the design you found to be the best. What worked well? What challenges did you face? Sport Exercise and Health	Create a sequence made up of at least 5 sets of different exercises - you could include star jumps, squats, using an invisible skipping rope among other things.	See if you can measure your pulse rate. Then do 2 minutes of vigorous exercise and test it again. Record it. Get the rest of your family to do it and try putting the results into a graph.	What happens to your body when you exercise? Create a poster to explain all the benefits	Perform your exercise sequence for members of your family and then get them to join in with you!
Outdoor Learning	Go for a walk and see how many different leaves you can find of different shapes and colours. Create a piece of autumnal collage using what you find.
