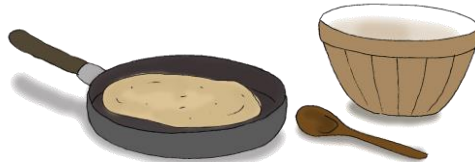

2. True or false? The sentence below does not need any commas.

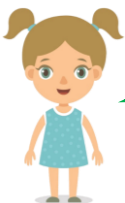
I love to exercise and I really enjoy playing football cricket and rugby with my friends.

Developing

1. **The missing comma is circled:** I like sugar, lemon and treacle on my pancakes when it is Pancake Day.
2. **False.** There should be a comma between 'football' and 'cricket'.
3. **George is correct.** The sentence contains a list of 3 words to describe the weather. There should be a comma between the first 2 words in the list which are 'cold' and 'wet'.

Expected

4. **One comma is missing. The missing comma is circled:** For my birthday this year I am hoping to get some exciting, new games, books, toys and sweets.
5. **False.** There should not be a comma after 'armbands'.
6. **Katya is correct** because a comma placed after 'and' would be incorrect. The list in this sentence is already correctly punctuated.
