Remember....

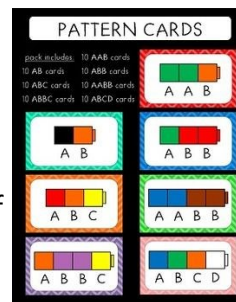
- PE days are Mondays and Wednesdays—please ensure ear-rings are removed and long hair is tied back.

Home Learning

We have been making AB B ABB and ABC patterns in Maths this week. Here are some examples....

Can you make a pattern of your own at home?



As we have a new class pet (our stick insect) we would love some name suggestions on what we can call it!

We have had another busy week in Acorn class. We have some changes happening to our tadpoles and stick insects. The tadpoles now have back legs and some have front legs. One of our stick insects eggs has hatched!

In phonics, we have learnt the sounds ee (as in cheese) and igh (as in night). Igh is a trigraph which means there are three letters making one sound. We have also learnt the word 'my'. In Maths, we have been working on patterns (see above). We had to continue patterns, make our own patterns and spot mistakes in patterns (Miss Traviss isn't very good at making patterns!). We have also been working on our number bonds to 10, number bonds are two numbers added together to make 10 e.g. 5 and 5 makes 10. We used numicon to demonstrate this.

In RE, we read the story of Abraham and Sarah, they were very old and didn't have any children. God told Abraham that he would have as many people in his family as there are stars. Abraham believed God as God always keeps his promises and one day they had a son called Isaac.

We have been trying hard with our writing this week, thinking of a sentence, holding the sentence in our head and then writing the sentence. In PE we have continued our athletic skills ready for sports day. Well done to our star of the week, Esme, who has made a great improvement with her phonic knowledge.
