We have been really impressed with the class attitude to learning and behaviour this week so well done Acorn class!

This week in phonics, we have learnt the sounds ar (as in star) and or (has in horn) and recapped on g c and k. We have been doing lots of writing using these sounds.

In Maths, we have been looking for three numbers which add together to make 10. We used numicon and 10s frames to show this. We have also been introduced to the numbers 11 to 20. Miss Traviss used 10s frames to demonstrate 11 was 10 and 1 more, 12 was 10 and 2 more etc.

In RE, we have learnt about Joseph who was given a multicoloured coat. Joseph had 11 brothers who were all jealous that he had been given a lovely coat and turned against him. Joseph believed that God would have a plan for him.

We have continued learning some learning about the Queen and London this week. We read the story 'Katie in London', Katie and her brother, Jack get taken around the sights of London by one of Trafalgar Square's lions. We have been writing about some of the places that they visited.

We have realised more of our froglets this week and most of our stick insects have now hatched! They will soon need to be moved to a bigger tank!
