#### Home Learning

Attached are two home learning ideas, one is working on number bonds to 5, the other is working on numbers beyond 10. Both of these areas of maths are important for the children to grasp by the end of their year in reception.

This week in phonics, we have learnt the sounds ur (as in fur), ow (as in cow) and oi (as in coin) and recapped ck, e, u and r. We have been doing lots of writing using these sounds.

In Maths, we have been looking at the numbers

11-30. We have been spotting patterns in the numbers. We have talked about the numbers as tens and ones so 11 is one ten and one one, 12 is two tens and two ones (or two)etc. We have made these numbers using tens frames, numicon, cubes and dienes blocks.

We have been sharing learning with year 3, they have read us their stories they have written in their English lessons. We then started designing a box scene, we had to draw what we wanted to put inside our box and write a list of materials that we needed. We got an exciting delivery of caterpillars this week, we can't wait for them to turn into butterflies! Our stick insects and tadpoles are doing well too! On Tuesday, we went to the church to celebrate St Barnabas Day. We found out a bit about what he did when he was alive and how he spread the word of God.

On Friday, we made a paddling pool in the outside area for the children to splash around in, they had lots of fun!

Well done to Mahe, our star of the week, for a great effort in phonics particularly with her letter formation.
