	Get Creative!	Let's Find Out!
Science and Computing	<p>Create a weather chart Create a weather chart for a week. Each day note down what the weather is like (Sunny? Rainy? Cloudy?). Is it hot or cold outside? Was the weather the same all week? If not, can you describe how it changed?</p> <p>We would love to see your completed weather chart!</p>	<p>Investigating everyday materials In class we have been finding out about different everyday materials. Investigate which everyday materials (e.g. metal, wood, paper, plastic, fabric, glass, stone/rock) you can find in your home.</p>  <p>You could create or draw pictures of the objects made from a particular everyday material or take photographs of what you find.</p>
Time and Place	<p>Build a model or draw a picture of your home In our Time and Place lessons we are learning about our surroundings. We would like you to build a model or draw a picture of your home. How many rooms does it have? Does it have more than one floor?</p> <p>When you are finished, please take a photo of your work and bring it into class so we can see for ourselves!</p>	<p>How has Tunbridge Wells changed? Find out about the ways in which Tunbridge Wells and life in the town have changed. Ask older members of your family what changes they have noticed. Has anything stayed the same? What was the park like? What were the shops like? What toys did they like to play with?</p> <p>Let us know what you find out so we can share it with the rest of the class!</p>
Design and the Arts	<p>Create your own portrait of your family In Art, we are learning about portraits and have been looking at different artists' self-portraits. Create your own self portrait or create a portrait of a member of your family or a friend if you prefer. Please bring in your artwork to show us once it is completed.</p>	<p>Find Out About Antony Gormley's sculptures Antony Gormley created The Angel of the North and other sculptures of people. Some pictures of his sculptures are included at the bottom of this sheet. Which do you like best? Can you create your own (smaller) version of your favourite piece of art?</p>

<p>Sport, Exercise and Health</p>	<p>Create an exercise routine Create an exercise routine using 5 different movements (for example: star jumps, stretching, jogging, balancing, skipping, jumping).</p> <p>Teach your family the exercise routine. Can they follow what you do? Can you explain what they need to do?</p> <p>Alternatively, why not show the class your routine and teach us how to do it.</p>	<p>Plan and make a healthy snack With the help of your parents plan and make a healthy snack for you and your family.
