It has been an unusual two weeks in Acorn class, thank you to Miss Burkinshaw and Mrs Allee who have kept the class afloat while Miss Traviss has been off sick.

We have nearly finished our second term of school! We had a fantastic school trip to post our letters to Santa last week and we thank the Amelia for inviting us in for Christmas crafts and a story.

The children's costumes for the nativity were fantastic, thank you to parents for providing these and I am sure you will join me in saying how well the children sung in front of the audience. In phonics, we have learnt the sounds 'ff' as in off, 'll' as in bell, 'ss' as in kiss and 's' making a z sound like in the words pigs and is. Ff, ss and ll are all digraphs and usually appear in the middle or at the end of a word. We have learnt the tricky words 'of' and 'put'.

In maths, we have continued our learning of numbers to 5. We have thought about one more and one less and demonstrated this using the song '5 current buns'. Using a 5 frame we showed that there was one less bun each time, but one more penny.

In PE, we have continued our climbing using the big apparatus to develop our gross motor skills and upper body strength. We have also continued our rugby practise with Mr Luckhurst and practised scoring a try.

We have set up our Christmas tree in the classroom and have enjoyed decorating it and redecorating it each day.




Our phonics scheme at St Barnabas is Twinkl Phonics. Here is some information about the sounds and words we have learnt this week that may support your child's learning at home.







When the letter 's' is after an unvoiced or quiet consonant, it is pronounced as a /s/, e.g. hats, tops, works, laughs, what's, moths. When the letter 's' is after a voiced consonant, it is pronounced as a /z/ sound, e.g. pigs, bugs, bags.

It can also be found at the end of some other words, such as his, has, is, as.
