SIAMS Inspection next week

All Church of England and Methodist schools are inspected approximately every five years by a SIAMS inspector from the Church of England, although there has been some delay to our inspections due to Covid.

A SIAMS inspection is an opportunity to highlight the impact that the school's distinctive Christian vision has on the flourishing of the whole school community. They will be seeking evidence to answer the inspection question:

'How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?'

Following the inspection, a report will be written and the inspection findings will be shared with you. The report will celebrate all that is special about the school and will identify next steps that are helpful in the school's ongoing development as a Church school. The report will be published on the school's website, and we would encourage you to read it.

We look forward to welcoming our inspector next week.

We need you!

We are looking for two parents to join the Full Governing Body of our school. If you feel you can devote the required time and energy to the role to try and achieve best possible outcomes for the children at the school, then we would like to hear from you.

Parent governors play a vital role on governing bodies, holding the unique position of having a parental viewpoint of the school. Through the children, they have a first - hand experience of the delivery of the curriculum, and how the school is perceived from the parents' point of view. This enables parent governors to bring a different perspective to the management of the school. It's a role that should listen impartially to concerns raised by parents, guide parents regarding appropriate lines of action and procedures, whilst presenting a balanced view of issues representing different sections of the community.

It is a key and highly rewarding role on the Board of Governors given its parental viewpoint, and one which has ample support and training. The Parent Governor will join the Governing Body, an elected body who support Mrs Duncombe in the leadership of the school. This includes overseeing the management side of the school, strategy, policy, budgeting and staffing. It has 12 members from the church, a staff member and two parent governor roles. Working alongside other members of the Governing body will be interesting and rewarding as those efforts seek to successfully fulfil its duties to all children at St Barnabas.

Minimum commitment, involves attendance of Full Governing Body Meetings 3 times per year, usually evening meetings (7-9pm), or via Googlemeet. There are also, Committees responsible for Teaching and Learning, as well as Finance and Resources, which meet at least 3 times per year to focus on the areas in question. In your Parental Governor role you will also be invited to make at least 3 Governor visits per year to keep your perspective on the school and how it operates updated.
