In maths this week we have been investigating length and height. We have used the words 'longest' 'shortest' and 'tallest'. We have learnt that length describes how far something is from one end to the other, and height tells us how far it is from the bottom to the top of an object. We have used pasta shapes to measure how long or playdough snakes are and compare who's was the longest and the shortest. We have also investigated how to make a tower that is taller and shorter than Mrs Tompsett's.

In phonics we have learnt the phonemes 'ar' and 'or' and revised the tricky words 'was' and 'my'.

The beginning of the week we held parents consultations, it was lovely to see so many of you to discuss your child's progress. If you have not seen us yet please do contact the class email so we can arrange a time after the Easter holidays.





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
Our phonics scheme at St Barnabas is Twinkl Phonics. This week we have learnt two digraphs (two letters making one sound) 'ar' and 'or'. We have spent two days on each sound, one with a reading focus and one with a writing focus. We have lots of sounds now and so this is enabling us to write bigger words and longer phrases.
