Alternatively, you can sign up online at www.summerreadingchallenge.org.uk where you will receive a virtual badge and certificate.

There is also a trophy for the school in Tunbridge Wells that reads the most books! This is a great activity for the summer holidays, and we would love to hear about all the books the children enjoyed when they return in September.
