Welcome to the end of another busy week.

As the weather gets hotter we have made the decision to not ask the children to wear water-proof jackets and trousers in the water tray. As a result, your child may get wet at school. Please could you ensure they have a change of uniform with them and that it is summer clothes. Many have a spare set of clothes but these are winter clothes.

This week Acorn Class have started looking after caterpillars, we will feed them, watch them grow, make a cocoon and turn in to butterflies when we will release them. Our group work has all focused on caterpillar lifecycles.

In phonics this week we have stared level 4. This level is a consolidation level where children practice all the level 2 and 3 sounds in a range of contexts and words.

In maths we have been looking at odd and even numbers, seeing if a number has a 'partner' and looking at the shape of the numicon pieces.


