This week, we have been learning to add the suffix **-es** to words ending in **y**.



Adding -es to to a noun makes it plural, which means there is more than one. Sometimes, when the noun ends in y , we change the y to an i and then add -es .	teddy teddies baby babies
When the y is part of a digraph, such as ay , oy or ey , we only need to add -s .	toy toys monkey monkeys
These rules are the same for verbs. Adding -es or -s to a root verb changes it from 1 st person to 3 rd person, e.g. I carry, he carries.	carry carries spr <mark>ay</mark> spr <mark>ays</mark>

A plural noun means there is more than one of something. Often, we add **-s** or **-es** to make nouns plural, e.g. **dogs, foxes**.

Although, there are some exceptions, e.g. **'children'** and **'sheep'**.






Adding -es to words ending in y
