Acorn News...

Our learning this week...

In Phonics we have learnt the sounds c (as in caterpillar) and k (as in kite). We have also learnt the tricky word 'the'. We have been practising to blend and segment words orally and have been writing and reading cvc words too!

In Maths we have been continuing with our subsisting skills. We have also been looking at the composition of number, this is the idea that numbers are made up of smaller numbers. We used the stem sentences 1 and 1 and 1 is three. We also learnt about number 4 and were introduced to the Numberblock 4. We had to find 4 things from around the classroom using the stem sentence 1 and 1 and 1 and another 1 is four.

In Drawing Club, we looked at an animation this week, I explained it was very old even older than your mummies and daddies and the grown ups in the class. We watched 'Mr Benn'. Mr Benn was being the zoo keeper and wanted to help all the animals to make the cages bigger. We have been learning new vocabulary—capture, habitat, protect, tearful We then drew pictures of the zoo, a new animal for the zoo and how we could catch our new animal so it would be in our zoo.

We have also learnt about Remembrance Day and why we wear poppies. The children were very knowledgeable about remembering soldiers who died in the war. We watched the CBeebies animation called 'Poppies' about the animals who were scared and had to hide. Then the poppies grew when the war was over.

We have also learnt about Diwali. We learnt it is a special festival for Hindus as it is a celebration of light and they worship the Goddess Lakshmi. We read 'Dipal's Diwali' and learnt about how they decorate their homes with diya lamps, made Rangoli patterns, ate lots of yummy food and visited the temple. We had a go at making our own too! We were very interested in mehndi patterns and have enjoyed during our own.





Acorn News...







