Our learning this week...

In Phonics we have learnt the sounds ck (as in duck), e (as in egg) and u (as in umbrella). We have also learnt the tricky words 'to' and 'I'. 'ck' is a digraph, which means that it is two letters making one sound. We have been practising to blend and segment words orally and have been writing and reading cvc words too! We have also been reading sentences with the sounds we have learnt and our tricky words in.

In Maths we have been continuing with our subsisting skills. We have been counting beats of the drum which is tricky as we can't touch them. We have to either count in our head or use our fingers to demonstrate each beat we can hear. We used cubes to demonstrate different ways that the numberblock 4 can make himself. We also used descriptive language to describe how the cubes were arranged. We have also been comparing amounts and use the words 'more' and 'fewer'.


We read the story 'Santa's Special Letter'. Santa had lost a special letter from Pip the littlest mouse and what she had asked Santa for. Luckily Santa found the letter and was able to give Pip what she wanted. We then wrote our own letters to Santa ready to post them next week.

We finished off our Diwali learning by painting our diyas lamps and having mendhi patterns drawn on our hands. The children were very patient when waiting for it to dry as it took at least 20 minutes!
