Adding -ed to words ending in e

When we change words ending in **e** to the past tense, we take away the **e** and add -**ed**.

scored joked

When you add **-ed** to a word that ends in **e**, the **-ed** suffix makes the /d/ or /t/ sound.

Adding -er to words ending in e

When adding -er to words ending in e, we take away the e and add -er.

hiker

baker
