We have limited time for changing so it really helps everyone if your child can change themselves independently. Please support us in allowing your child to practise getting themselves dressed and undressed for school independently.

#### Our learning this week...

In Phonics, we have learnt the sounds sh (as in sheep) and th (as in moth). We have also learnt the tricky word, be. We have been practising reading and writing words with these sounds in. We played Kim's Game where we had to look at the objects then close our eyes and one was taken away. We had to write down the object that was taken away. All the objects contained sounds in that we had learnt recently. For our tricky word we practised reading sentences and thinking of our own sentences using the word. Some children have been writing sentences using our tricky words! Please remember to practise tricky words at home too!

In Maths, we have been looking at mass and capacity. Mass is how heavy or light an object is and capacity is how much of an object (liquid, buttons, cubes) a container can hold. We have been using a variety of containers in the classroom to talk about whether it is full, empty or half full. We also guess how much cups of water would fit into our chosen containers. The children had a chance to make cakes this week where they had to balance all the ingredients to make sure they weighed the same as the egg.

Instead of Drawing Club this week, we have been writing 'who am i?' fact files. We had to write three statements about our chosen animal e.g. 'it has wings' then make a flap over the animal for our friends to guess what animal we had drawn based on the statements we had written.

For our challenges this week we had to draw an observational drawing of one of the animals we saw from Jaws n Claws. We had to think about the colours we were using to make sure we didn't have an orange tortoise! We also ordered the numbers to 10 and had to put the correct number of objects under each numeral. Then we looked 'dot art' or 'pointillism' and had to recreate a animal picture using paint and cotton buds.



Our learning this week...

Our phonics scheme at St Barnabas' is Twinkl Phonics. We have started level 3 this week, which is very exciting. The children are already doing brilliantly. These are the sounds and tricky word we have learnt this week. It would be super if you could practice with your child at home.



#### Home Learning

- Please practise the sounds and words we have learnt this week at home. Each child has a sound mat in their reading book folder to support them with this.
