We have had a very busy week and it has been wonderful to go into the classrooms and see our children learning their times tables and Phonics.

Our Acorn children have stayed all morning and on Thursday had a special talk about how we teach Phonics. Today they are having their class picnic. The children have settled in well and we are looking forward to seeing them with us all day from next Monday.

Fr. John came in on Wednesday to talk about St Matthew and we found out about St Matthew's life. The children sang beautifully and it is always wonderful to hear our school sing.

## **This week in class:**

### **Acorn**

This week we have been learning the s phoneme. We have been making spotty snakes, listening for this phoneme at the beginning of words and trying to write the s grapheme. We had lots of fun in our first Write Dance lesson, making s shapes in the air with long ribbons. In Maths, we have been working on our counting skills by playing counting games together and singing some counting songs. We have been very busy making new friends and we have settled very well into our lunchtime routines and have enjoyed having school dinners this week!

### **Willow**

This week Willow Class have been discussing and using adjectives to describe a sea scene and sea creatures. The children have started to draw their own story board for the story of 'Finding Nemo' and have made a cover for their topic books. In RE we have been discussing things that we are grateful for and thinking about what type of world we would create. In PE the children have been practising chest passes and finding different ways to move. In Maths the children have been finding number bonds for 10 using 10 grids and been describing and naming 3D shapes. The children have been learning to log onto the laptops using their own login and have also been using Mathletics. The children are continuing to practice writing their numbers round the right way, particularly 2 digit numbers.

### **Beech**

Beech Class have are now settled in well. They are learning about what caused the Great Fire of London. The children have worked really hard at practising their handwriting and we can already see an improvement!

We had a fabulous RE trip to St Barnabas' Church yesterday learning about the font, lectern, pulpit and altar. Beech Class asked some very thoughtful and challenging questions. In English we have started reading 'George and the Dragon'. They wrote some exciting sentences using different adjectives to describe the dragon. A fierce, scaly, red, powerful dragon!

### **Maple**

This week, we have been enjoying the book 'I'll take you to Mrs Cole' by Nigel Gray and Michael Foreman. The children have been creating lists of things they could imagine being in Mrs Cole's cellar... some very vivid pictures! They have also been working on adding suffixes to words ending in 'e', based on some of the vocabulary in the book. In Maths, we have been adding 1-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers using known number facts, and working hard on our times tables as usual!

As part of our Science topic, Rocks, Fossils and Soil, we have been learning about the 3 different rock types: igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic. We also sorted natural and man-made rocks and looked at their uses. Thank you to Evie and Grace for bringing in an impressive ammonite to show us.

As we settle into Year 3, we are focusing on listening skills and co-operation. On Wednesday we managed to pass a hoop round a circle of 30 without dropping hands. Well done Team Maple!

### **Chestnut**

Chestnut Class have had an exciting week starting our main topic 'How to Train Your Dragon'. We have been using our imaginations to think up different ways to catch a dragon and writing instructions to help others catch a dragon. In Maths we have continued to look at place value and ordering numbers, helping us to solve problems with the facts that we have learnt. As a class we started reading the book 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell. The story is set around a Viking named Hiccup. We have been looking at the British history timeline and seeing where the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons fit in. We have been imagining what it would be like to live in those times and how we would feel with invaders/settlers entering our land. It has been a busy few days.

### **Lilac**

In Maths this week Lilac Class have been solving problems about money using addition and subtraction. We have also been working with numbers that are up to three decimal places. In English we have been continuing our reading of 'Street Child' and have been working in groups discussing why characters behave the way they do. We have presented our ideas to the class. Our work about the Victorians this week has been about the differences between the lives of the rich and the poor and we have also been looking at child labour and the hard lives that poor children had in the Victorian times. In Science we have been focusing on scientific language associated with classifying the properties of materials. In Music we have been singing songs from the musical Oliver! In RE we have been continuing our work about the Five Pillars of Islam.

### **Oak**

In Oak Class this week, we have been reading Perseus and Medusa. The children then wrote some amazing, vivid descriptions of Medusa.

In Maths, we have continued to work on multiplication. The children also worked on an arithmetic test and some Maths investigations. In Maths the children were focusing on identifying large numbers and rounding them to 2 and 3 decimal places. In our topic work, we created a timeline of Ancient Greece. We also looked at Greek pottery and the children began to design their own vases.

Oak Class wrote persuasive letters from Pandora to Zeus, begging him to undo the evils that were unleashed from the box. The children made their own boxes, filled with 'poverty, sadness, sickness and death' and not forgetting 'hope'. In RE the class examined the trinity and had some expert input from Father John.
